Fort HealthCare is a locally owned and controlled not-forprofit community-based network of highest-quality healthcare services, including Fort Memorial Hospital, Fort Medical Group, FortCare PPO and Fort Memorial Hospital Foundation, dedicated to the health, well-being and safety of neighbors living in Fort Atkinson, Johnson Creek, Jefferson, Whitewater, Lake Mills, Cambridge, Palmyra and the surrounding area.

Fort Memorial Hospital is a fully accredited, 110 licensedbed facility with more than 100 physicians on staff, providing caring service to our communities. In addition to comprehensive inpatient services and short-term Medicare-certified skilled nursing care, the hospital offers ambulatory surgery and specialty clinics, a birthing center, cardiac rehabilitation, emergency services including the Urgent Care program for after-hours treatment of minor illnesses and injuries, advanced diagnostics and more.

Fort Medical Group is a multispecialty physician group practice network of more than 50 doctors, nurses and other professionals providing the highest-quality healthcare and counsel. From pediatrics to geriatrics, from women's health to family health, you can count on our team of professionals to provide exceptional care.

SUPPORT GROUPS AID IN HEALING

Creating an environment where community members can gather to support one another is one of the ways Fort HealthCare lives its mission. Both hospital-based and registered community support groups may gather for free at Fort Memorial Hospital in Fort Atkinson. Something therapeutic happens when the ups and downs of a medical condition are shared with others. Progress is much more likely to occur when patients can share their experiences and support one another. Groups using Fort HealthCare services and facilities regularly support patients and loved ones who experience bariatric/LAP-BAND® surgery, diabetes, multiple sclerosis, ostomy, postpartum depression and more.

CARING FOR YOU IN AN EMERGENCY

and local EMTs treat patients using guidelines

The Paramedic Intercept program provides advanced lifesaving care at the scene of an accident or illness and is the first program of its kind offered by a Wisconsin hospital. Fort HealthCare's licensed paramedics—emergency medical technicians (EMTs) with the highest level of additional training—travel in a four-wheel-drive vehicle containing lifesaving equipment and medications to meet local rescue services en route to the hospital.

Together, the Fort HealthCare paramedics

prepared by Fort Memorial Hospital emergency department physicians. Fort HealthCare paramedics demonstrate their skill and dedication by responding to more than 750 calls per year—roughly 20 percent of all 911 calls in our service area.

FREE DENTAL CARE

The Community Dental Clinic in Fort Atkinson came to life through many generous contributions, including the volunteer services of 16 area dentists. Since the program began in 2007, the number of patients served by the free dental clinic has almost doubled. Patients receive standard evaluations and exams, X-rays, cleanings for adults and children ages 3 and older, fluoride treatments, sealants, fillings, extractions, smoking-cessation information, and oral health and dietary counseling. Fort HealthCare offers technical support, lab services and the rental of a 1,200-square-foot medical office for \$1 per year.

The Fort HealthCare Paramedic Intercept Vehicle, purchased by the Fort HealthCare Partners, speeds to the scene of an accident or illness. Paramedics supplement the critical care provided by local EMTs.

FAITH COMMUNITIES PARTNER WITH FORT HEALTHCARE

The Faith Nurse program was created to better support the faith and parish nurses in area congregations. Fort HealthCare shares information and expertise at regular community faith

nurse group meetings. In return, participating churches and nurses work with Fort HealthCare to provide specific resources, education and support to the faith nurses. The Fort HealthCare Faith Nurse program assists faith-based health professionals, clergy and lay leaders with a goal to promote health in mind, body and spirit. The

Faith Nurse program puts people who are homebound, uninsured or unable to care for themselves in touch with caring hands, supported by a network of like-minded individuals and the area's leading community health network, free of charge.

Faith Nurse programs can improve awareness and use of available healthcare services, and promote health and healing by empowering individuals to incorporate key elements from their belief systems into their healthcare plans.

GRASSROOTS COMMUNITY WELLNESS EFFORTS SUPPORTED

Fort HealthCare contributes to a variety of local nonprofit organizations. Selected based on strict guidelines, the majority of recipients are locally based groups dedicated to health- and wellness-related causes. While the largest sponsorships go to area Relays for Life (Whitewater, Fort Atkinson and Lake Mills) and Tomorrow's Hope, many smaller grassroots organizations benefit as well. These include high school athletic booster clubs as well as agencies dedicated to eliminating physical and mental abuse, addressing bicycle safety, improving literacy and caring for the terminally ill. In addition to donations and sponsorships totaling more than \$25,000 per year, Fort HealthCare donates countless items to be handed out to event participants or sold

via silent auctions. We believe our support for these local health and wellness organizations helps spread the seeds of compassion, concern and generosity—traits already well-rooted in Fort HealthCare's communities.

A MAJOR DONATION TO A STRONG PARTNER

Recently, the Fort HealthCare board of directors authorized support of the Rainbow Hospice, Inc. capital campaign with a donation valued at approximately \$250,000 over a five-year period. Rainbow Hospice is building an inpatient facility on donated land on Highway 26, just north of Interstate 94, in Johnson Creek. Plans call for construction of a 12,000-square-foot, eight-bed facility. It will provide care and comfort to patients with terminal illnesses and their families. Completion is estimated in 2010.

Fort HealthCare has joined other community organizations in providing funding and resources to Rainbow Hospice since its founding in 1990. In addition, Fort HealthCare has provided ongoing guidance, with two staff members serving on the Rainbow board of directors.

"Fort HealthCare's support of the proposed inpatient facility is important for many reasons," said Michael Wallace, president and CEO of Fort HealthCare. "There is a real need for a specially designed facility for persons who are terminally ill and who, for a variety of reasons, can no longer be cared for at Fort Memorial Hospital or at home. Rainbow has been an exceptional partner and resource for us in these situations."

Perhaps the greatest benefit of the Well Ways program is that it offers free cholesterol and blood sugar screening valued at more than \$50. Any member of the community can obtain a lab slip by contacting the Health Promotion department at (920) 568-5161; at any of the free monthly Fort HealthCare blood pressure, bone density and cholesterol screenings or community events; or online at www.FortHealthCare.com.

Upon the completion of lab work, test results are mailed along with a membership welcome letter and private login information for the Well Ways Members Only portion of the Fort HealthCare Web site. Enrollees log in, create a profile and complete questions for the General Health Assessment to receive a personalized health report.

FINANCIAL AID OPTIONS

At Fort HealthCare, we believe concern over a hospital bill should never get in the way of a patient receiving good healthcare. Today's health insurance system requires most people to assume responsibility for some health-related expenses. Our reliance on reimbursement for our services allows us to provide the highest-quality services and continue to employ approximately 1,000 individuals. While we expect patients to contribute to the cost of their care, we do take into account each individual's ability to pay. Our goal is to work with you to arrange a manageable payment plan.

Fort HealthCare offers two financial aid options to patients who meet income, asset and need criteria:

- The **Self Pay Discount** is a discount of up to 20 percent off charges for Fort Memorial Hospital inpatient and outpatient services. Those who may be eligible include:
 - Patients who have no health insurance
 - Patients receiving services that are NOT covered by health insurance or another state, government, liability or workers' compensation program
- Community Care is a partial or complete write-off of all outstanding charges. Those who may be eligible include:
 - Patients requiring medically necessary treatment with no or limited ability to pay and whose income does not exceed current federal poverty guidelines
 - Patients whose income exceeds current federal poverty guidelines, but whose expenses also exceed income
 - Patients whose accounts do not indicate any additional third-party reimbursement
