

# TNCC FAST-TRACK COURSE

The TNCC Fast Track Course is a 1-day course developed by the Emergency Nurses Association (ENA) specifically designed for experienced RNs who have taken TNCC in the past, and who still wish to experience hands-on skills stations and short instructor-led discussions.

After the completion of the course, the ENA will award students with 10.75 CNE hours and a 4-year certificate as a TNCC provider.

## Course Format

- **Manual:** The latest edition of the TNCC Provider Manual includes evidence-based content developed by trauma emergency experts. This 24-chapter, comprehensive manual is included in the registration of this FAST-TRACK Course (\$270- Book included), books will be delivered to students after registration is finalized. **Please note that registration will be closed 14 days before the start of class.**
- **Online modules:** Online modules with links to additional information are provided and assigned by the ENA prior to the course date. These modules allow students to learn at their own pace, apply what they have learned and receive immediate feedback, and refer to information learned at any time. The modules are a complete case study process - taking students through the entire sequence of care.

**Completion of these modules is mandatory prior to the start of class. A rescheduling fee of \$100 applies if unable to attend the course due to incomplete modules.**

- **Live simulation:** TNCC includes training using both an individual and a team approach. Multiple trauma nursing process skills stations offer students the opportunity to practice trauma patient assessments and interventions in a controlled environment. Each student will be expected to lead a simulation in preparation for the skills station test.
- **Instructor-led classroom discussions and skills stations:** This fast-track course is designed as a refresher and will not include any of the thick content of the course. **Students are still expected to come prepared to class, by reading the entire**

**manual. These instructor-led discussions are not intended to provide basic knowledge.** Instead, they are designed to allow students to clarify concepts and expand knowledge.

- **Testing:** after the completion of the course students will have the opportunity to complete a skills test station where they will put into practice the systematic approach learned during class. After the skills test, students will proceed to take an electronic, open-book, open-resource test - No more test anxiety!!

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
