Colorectal Screening

Please remember the Colonoscopy is still the preferred recommendation from Fort HealthCare. A colonoscopy is the best colorectal cancer screening test because it also allows your doctor to prevent colorectal cancer. Other non-colonoscopy screening tests look for signs of blood, and in some cases, DNA markers, in your stool that can be signs of colorectal cancer.

Eye Exams Screening

2. SeniorCare is a prescription drug assistance program for Wisconsin residents who are 65 years of age or older and meet the enrollment requirements. The program is designed to help seniors with their prescription drug costs. To enroll in SeniorCare you must: Be a Wisconsin resident, be a U.S. citizen or have qualifying immigrant status, be 65 years of age or older and fill out a SeniorCare application.

Every senior enrolling in SeniorCare must pay an annual \$30 fee. The earliest you can apply is during the calendar month of your 65th birthday. If you are already age 65 or older, you can apply at any time. Your benefits will begin in the month after you apply. Your annual income determines your level of coverage in SeniorCare and how much SeniorCare will cover. See the Annual Income Limit table for out-of-pocket expenses and benefits for each level of participation.
